Parent FAQs

What happens at camp?

Each day, your child will participate in group activities, including a blend of physically active games (such as swimming, boating, gagaball, basketball) and



spiritually significant experiences (such as devotions, Bible quiz, worship services). Lake Placid is an **overnight camp**, so campers will eat, sleep, and live there for 5 days.

Who will take care of my child?

Every child will be assigned to a camp leader, who will act as the child's guardian for the week. Camp leaders are adults (18 years old or older) who are volunteers at Lakeview Kids or parents of campers. All leaders pass a background check and go through a training orientation to make sure your child is safe!

Who will my child be with? Where will they stay?



Specific room assignments for your child will be determined by the camp in advance, based on the ages and preferences of the campers. You can indicate your child's roommate preferences during registration.



All children will be housed in one of two dormitories, separated by sex. Camp leaders will be housed in the dorms but in separate rooms across the hall, so they will be able to check on your child or provide support if a child wakes up with a nightmare or illness. But no adults will be sleeping in the same room as your child.

How are the kids getting to camp?



Your \$20 transportation fee (paid separately to Lakeview Church) helps pay for a professionally-driven bus ride to and from camp. Children will be seated on a

school bus, and luggage will be placed in a van / trailer.

What is the **schedule** like at camp?

We keep it structured enough to not get kids bored, and flexible enough to allow active kids to have some freedom! Click here for a sample schedule!

Is there **financial help** to go to camp?

Yes! Donations provide scholarship opportunities to help reduce the cost of camp for families in need. To apply for a scholarship, complete the application form and turn it in to the



church office by May 1. Scholarships will be awarded during the month of May to allow for registration before the May 30 deadline.



How do I register my child for camp?



The best registration option is to register online. This is the most accurate and efficient way to make sure your child's spot is saved, paid for, and included with our church. You can register online by paying in full or, if you've received a scholarship code, by making a partial payment.

The alternative registration option is to register via paper. Paper forms are available at Lakeview Kids and must be turned in at the church office along with a check, payable to Lakeview Church. This method costs an additional \$5.



What is the deadline for registration?

May 30 is the deadline for the regular rate (\$255 + \$20 transportation fee, \$275 total). After June 1, the rate jumps to \$295 + \$20 transportation fee (\$315 total). No registrations will be accepted after June 21.

What should I do if my child has medications?



Turn in medications and the completed medication form to the registration team when you drop your child off. The leader will transport medication to the camp nurse, who will store, track, and dispense all medication during camp.

Inhalers may be kept by the child in some situations.



What should I do if my child has a **special situation** (**bedwetting**, **anxiety**, **food restrictions**, etc.)?

Please let your child's cabin leader know when you drop him or her off. If you feel there are extenuating circumstances that need to be known in advance, please email kids@lakeviewchurch.org.



Can I call my child at camp, or can my child call me?



In case of an emergency, it is possible to reach Lake Placid camp's office (765-348-4342) to



contact a child. You can also contact the church (317-243-9396), who can contact Pastor Jonathan. Cell phone coverage is

very poor at Lake Placid, and we do not encourage the children to carry cell phones at camp, as electronics regularly get broken, misplaced, and stolen. A great way to keep in touch is to follow Lakeview Kids' Facebook page for updates. You can also send them old-fashioned mail, which is a big highlight for kids at "mail call" each morning!
